1. MEDICATION SCHEDULE

Frequency: Every 4 hours

Method: Syringe administration

Times: 12:00 PM, 3:00 PM, 6:00 PM

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BRIANNA: "When you pack Teagan up don't forget all of his bottles including the ones I left the fridge when I left, and his toys and bottle warmer and also there is a charger for his monitor in the middle drawer in the island the white one will you bring that as well"

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Legal Significance: Micromanagement of basic parenting

Pattern: Assumes father's incompetence

Impact: Undermines father's role

2. MEDICAL MICROMANAGEMENT

Date: July 14, 2025 - 12:15 PM

Bates Number: BW-MED-007

Evidence:

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BRIANNA: "Don't forget to food Teagan and give him his medicine if you didn't do it already"

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Legal Significance: Undermining medical care ability

Pattern: Excessive instructions for basic tasks

Impact: Creates unnecessary conflict

3. CONTINUED MICROMANAGEMENT

Date: July 16, 2025 - 3:22 PM

Bates Number: BW-MED-008

Evidence:

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BRIANNA: "He needs to eat again and meds if you didn't already"

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Legal Significance: Pattern of assuming incompetence

Pattern: Ongoing micromanagement

Impact: Undermines parenting confidence

TIMELINE OF EVENTS

1. INITIAL DEMAND - July 9, 2025

Bates Number: BW-MED-009

Evidence:

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BRIANNA: "You need to send me \$100 so I can finish the abortion process on Friday"

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Legal Significance: Financial demand for medical procedure

Pattern: Using personal situation for financial gain

Impact: Creates financial obligation

2. APPOINTMENT SCHEDULING - July 11, 2025

Bates Number: BW-MED-010

Evidence: Abortion scheduled in another state

Legal Significance: Interstate travel for illegal procedure

Pattern: Unilateral decision-making

Impact: Potential criminal violation

3. RENEWED DEMAND - July 15, 2025**Bates Number:** BW-MED-011**Evidence:**

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BRIANNA: "I also need \$100 for abortion today"

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Legal Significance: Continued financial demands**Pattern:** Using medical procedure for extortion**Impact:** Financial manipulation**LEGAL IMPLICATIONS****CRIMINAL VIOLATIONS**

- ****Interstate Travel**** - Georgia law violations
- ****Financial Extortion**** - Using medical procedure for money
- ****Character Evidence**** - Judgment and decision-making concerns

CIVIL IMPLICATIONS

- ****Unilateral Decision-Making**** - Pattern of excluding father
- ****Financial Manipulation**** - Using medical needs for gain
- ****Emotional State**** - Impact on co-parenting ability

MEDICAL CARE CONFLICTS**PATTERN OF CONTROL****1. ASSUMING INCOMPETENCE****Method:** Excessive instructions for basic care**Pattern:** Treating father as incapable**Impact:** Undermines parenting role**Legal Significance:** Pattern of control and manipulation**2. CREATING OBSTACLES****Method:** Complex instructions and requirements**Pattern:** Making care unnecessarily difficult**Impact:** Discourages involvement**Legal Significance:** Obstruction of parenting

3. USING MEDICAL NEEDS FOR CONTROL

Method: Leveraging child's medical requirements

Pattern: Using health needs as bargaining chip

Impact: Creates anxiety and conflict

Legal Significance: Emotional manipulation

EVIDENCE ANALYSIS**MEDICAL CARE PATTERN: 7/10****Strengths:**

- Clear pattern of micromanagement
- Documented excessive instructions
- Assumption of incompetence
- Control through medical needs

Weaknesses:

- Could argue legitimate concern
- Medical needs are complex
- Child's health is priority

ABORTION EVIDENCE: 8/10**Strengths:**

- Clear financial demands
- Interstate travel implications
- Pattern of unilateral decisions
- Character evidence

Weaknesses:

- Personal medical decision
- Could argue privacy rights
- Political sensitivity

OVERALL MEDICAL EVIDENCE: 7.5/10**Combined Impact:**

- Pattern of control and manipulation
- Using medical needs for leverage

- Unilateral decision-making
- Character and judgment concerns

STRATEGIC USE

COURT PRESENTATION

Focus: Pattern of control and manipulation

Method: Documented micromanagement

Impact: Demonstrates inability to co-parent

Goal: Support custody modification

DISCOVERY REQUESTS

Medical Records: Child's complete medical history

Care Instructions: All written care plans

Communication: Medical-related discussions

Purpose: Complete medical care documentation

EVIDENCE PRESERVATION

Method: Screenshots of all medical communications

Storage: Secure medical documentation

Authentication: Timestamp verification

Chain of Custody: Documented preservation

RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

IMMEDIATE (1-2 weeks)

- ****Document All Medical Instructions**** - Complete timeline
- ****Screenshot Medical Communications**** - Preserve evidence
- ****Record Care Patterns**** - Micromanagement documentation

SHORT-TERM (1 month)

Evidence: Ongoing micromanagement

Goal: Show inability to co-parent
